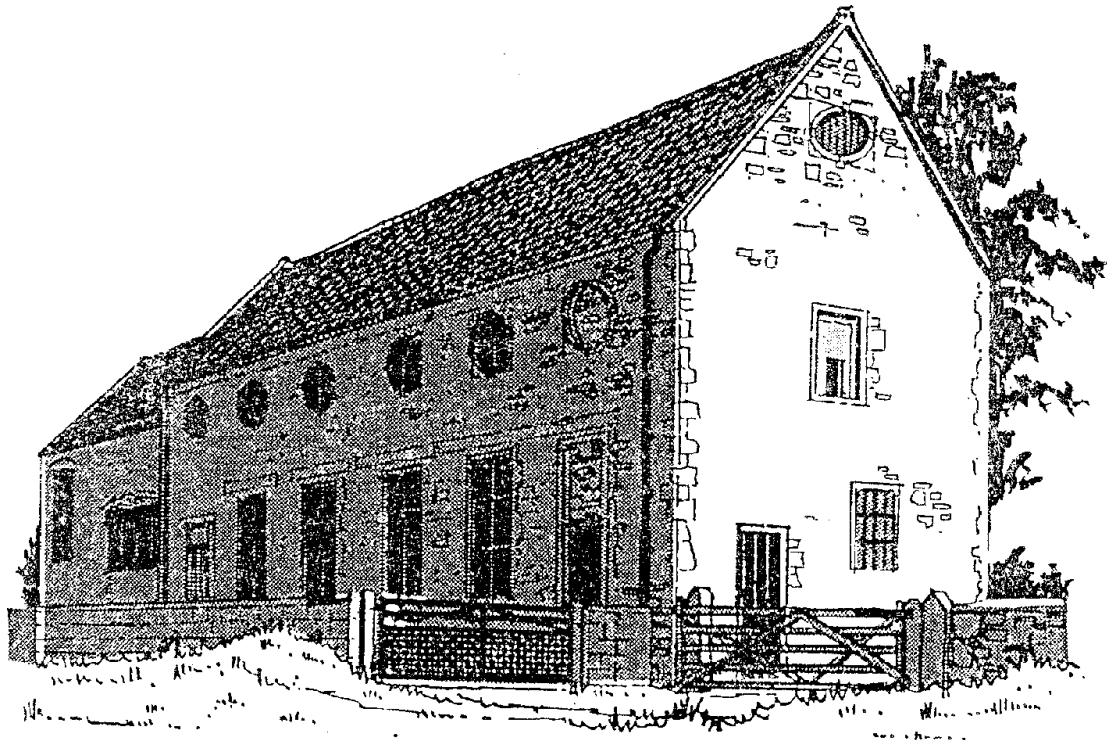

Backwell, the 1891 Census - Some Observations

Romantic readers will picture Backwell before the First World War as a village where the sun shone on lawns where honey was for tea and where the church clock (if we had had one) would have stopped at ten to three. The more prosaic of you will think of the hard work faced by the vast majority of the population and the ever present fear of poverty at a time when there was no National Insurance and when the very poorest turned only with the greatest reluctance to the Relieving Officer.

We would probably think of Backwell as a village that had not changed for generations, where the population was static and where the vast majority was tied to the land and dominated by the local landowners. We usually assume that at a time of relatively small movements of population the old were cared for by their children. Did this really happen to the extent we imagine?

It would be natural to assume that most of the people who spent their lives in Backwell in 1891 had been born there. This is before the days of motor cars but, of course, the railways were well established, and the industrial revolution had encouraged movements of populations. Backwell though, had no significant industry to attract newcomers.

If we take the Head of Household, and his wife (if the woman is not the Head), as examples of adults well settled in the village, we see, however, that this assumption is only partially true. Only 32% of these adults were born in Backwell, although another 45.7% were born outside but within 20 miles of the village as the crow flies. Nevertheless, this leaves 22.3% born farther away - and some of these a very long way away! - from Middlesex, Cheshire and Lincolnshire, for example, one from Scotland and one from Burma (no, a woman, not an ex-soldier).

Why did they come to Backwell?

One possibility was that they were males who married Backwell girls and settled here. In fact more or less as many women as men moved into the village and not all as married couples. Girls came as servants, for example, from Wales. Actually Backwell residents represented 22 counties in 1891.

Apart from moving from neighbouring villages, these people did not follow each other from the same towns or villages, either. Those who were born in Somerset, for example, came from 70 different villages or towns. Somerset, of course, was the largest county of origin.

So, it seems, there was a naturally large movement of population in 1891 even when there was no obvious attraction of heavy industry. This had significant implications for care of the elderly, very few of whom were living unemployed with younger relatives. In fact there was

no retirement age at that time so most people worked as long as they were physically capable of doing so.

POPULATION VARIATION

While the householders in Backwell moved in, young Backwellians presumably moved out. This must have been so or the total population would have grown. In fact it remained fairly static throughout the nineteenth century.

The temporary increase between 1831 and 1851 has been put down to the workers living in the area to build the railway. (Victoria County History of Somerset).

AGE PATTERN

It is difficult to draw conclusions from the age pattern as to the likelihood of someone born in Backwell reaching a ripe old age. The amount of immigration into the village and the presumed similar pattern of emigration blurs the facts.

What is certain is that not many people living in Backwell in 1891 had reached the promised three score years and ten - only **15 men** and **14 women**. Many of these were people who had earlier moved into the village, but most from nearby. An interesting point is that the number of men and women were similar. Presumably the hard labour undertaken by men levelled out the longterm demands on the body

suffered by women who had to undergo the Victorian tribulations of childbirth.

Of the **29 people** mentioned above, 9 were only just 70 years of age. The 29 were:

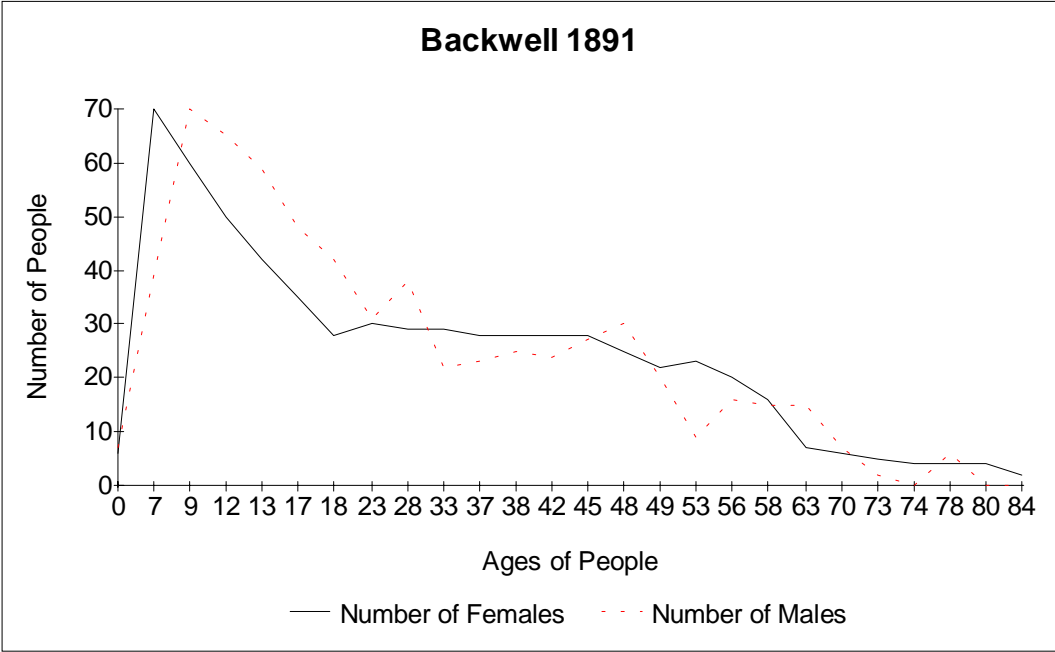

Many of the people named on the previous page were still working. Even Caroline Sellick, aged 82, was working as a grocer, presumably helped by her daughter-in-law.

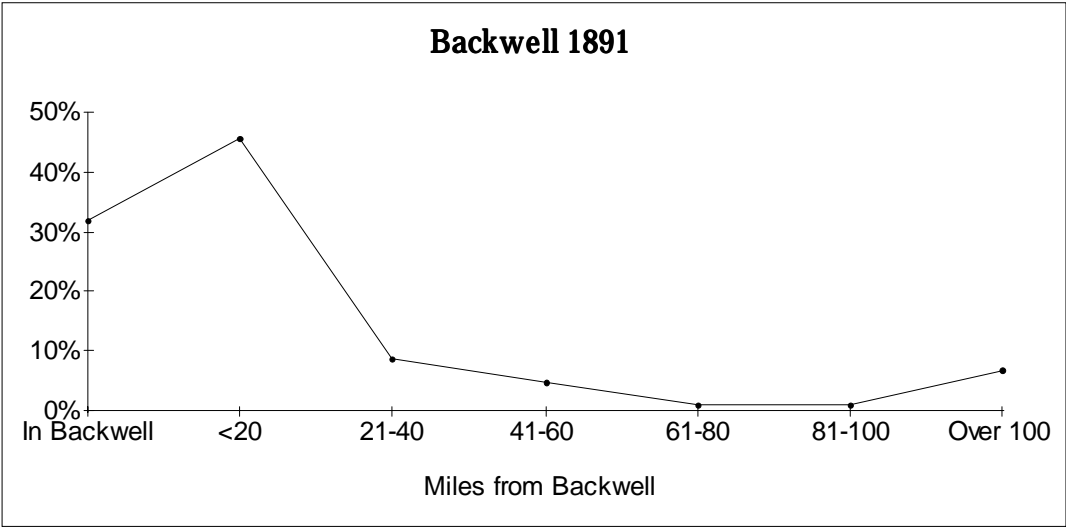
There is a distinct division in the pattern between those over and under 15, and again those over and under 50 years of age. This seems to indicate that the latter contained families which moved into the village in greater numbers than families who moved out, and that these arrivals raised families, or brought children with them, who exceeded in number their parents.

In 189 inhabited homes there were 29 babies under one year of age and 160 children aged 5 or under - almost averaging one per household.

Among these are some familiar Backwell names such as Bane, Horler, Lock, Lott, Marks, Ogborn and Sams.

It seems odd that in a village of 189 houses there should be 222 different surnames. This certainly would not happen in Wales! 76 of these names were of people with no other person of that name in the village. The most common name in the village was Lock. 30 people had this surname. Other common names were Horler (27), Vowles (23), Rogers (22), Young (20), Gallop (17), Phillips (16), Griffin (15), Ball (13), and Stokes (13).

It should not be assumed that these were 'popular' surnames because they came from the largest families. None of them, in fact, came from the largest Backwell families. The largest was the family of 12 of Alfred Bees of Churchtown. He was a cordwainer aged 42 from Bristol, and lived with his wife Louisa, 40, and his children Alfred 18, Amy 16, Thomas 15, George 13, Mabel 10, Gilbert 8, Percy 6, Hilda 4, Albina 3 and Rosina aged 1. The parents were choosing rather exotic names for their later children. Perhaps they were running out of ideas.

William Cole, a plaisterer and tiler aged 45, living near Park Farm, managed with his wife Isabel, aged 46, to keep to more usual names for nine of their ten children but couldn't resist one more dramatic name - Theophilus - for their third son. Other large families were the Carpenters, Breams, Popes and Missons, all with eight children. These are all examples of families with surviving children, of course, and from their ages it may be deduced that they suffered no child deaths. Other parents in Backwell may well have had as many children but lost some of them. It is not easy to pick out possible examples where parents had a sequence of children with one or two significant gaps. Possibly child deaths were not that common by this end of the nineteenth century. An example, however, may be the family of James Rossiter, a builder and farmer, of West Town. His children were aged 21,20,13,12,9,2. However, there are several other possible reasons for this spread of ages.

EMPLOYMENT

Backwell was virtually self-sufficient in 1891. Most professions, crafts and trades were represented by people living here. Some, however, are absent. No lawyer or solicitor lived in the village, neither did a wheelwright nor a miller.

Those living here were:

Accountant.

Baker(6), baker's assistant, beer retailer (3), beer seller (off-licence), blacksmith, builder.

Carpenter (3), carpenter's assistant, carter, cattle dealer, charwoman, clerk (corporation), clerk (merchant's), clerk (railway), commercial traveller, commercial traveller retired, cordwainer (shoemaker), corn merchant,.

Dressmaker (8), dressmaker's apprentice.

Engine driver & threshing machine driver, engine stoker, engineer (civil), engineer (mining).

Farm bailiff (2), farmer (27), farmer's assistant (15), farmer retired (2).

Gamekeeper (3), ganger plate, gardener domestic, gardener (15), gardener under, gardener market (2), gardener's assistant, grocer (2).

Haulier (9), house decorator.

Labourer/agricultural (38), labourer/general (49), laundress (17).

Mason (9), mason's labourer (2), minercoal, mother's help (5).

Oil seed crusher (2).

Painter (5), plasterer and tiler, plasterer (2), plumber and glazier, postman, postboy, postmaster(sub) and postman, postmaster(sub) assistant.

Quarrymaster.

Railway platelayer (2), railway stationmaster, rector, relieving officer, ropemaker.

Schoolmaster, schoolmaster retired, schoolmistress (3), schoolmistress assistant, sculptor monumental, sculptor artist painting, seamstress, servant agricultural, servantdomestic (66), stationer wholesale, surgeon and general practitioner, surgeon veterinary.

Tailor, / tailoress (2), tanner, teacher pupil, thatcher, timber dealer, traveller oilseed crusher.

Well sinker (2).

It comes as no surprise that the largest areas of employment are on the land or in domestic service. Widows and spinsters had to scrape a living in any way they could. If skilled, they were sometimes dressmakers. If unskilled, they were laundresses or domestic servants. Many of the domestic servants were young, unmarried girls, however.

Although Backwell today is a very pleasant place to live, it must have been a far closer knit community a hundred years ago. No doubt we would find it far too physically demanding and mentally stultifying, but for people who had experienced no other form of life the support of neighbours and the slower pace of life must have had its rewards - if only measured by the number of beer retailers for a small number of people!
